POSTAGE.

An Act to regulate the Postage of Letters in New South Wales. [22nd November, 1825.]

Preamble.

Act of Parliament of the 9th Queen Anne recited.

Relative to the dominions.

WHEREAS by an Act made in the ninth year of the reign of Queen Anne intituled "An Act for establishing a General " Post Office for all Her Majesty's Dominions and for settling a " Weekly Sum out of the Revenues thereof for the Service of the War " and for other Her Majesty's occasions" certain provisions were made for the erection of one General Letter Office and Post Office for all erection of one Post Her Majesty's dominions and for the appointment of one Master of Office and the appointment of a Post Such General Letter Office and Post Office by the name and style of Master General for All Her Said Majesty's Post Master General with power and authority amongst all Hersaid Majesty's other

other things to settle Posts for the carrying and receiving of all Letters to and from all parts and places of Her Majesty's Dominions as in the said Act is more particularly mentioned.

may deem reasonable and proper.

3. And be it further enacted That every person so appointed Post Who are to conform Master or Deputy Post Master as aforesaid shall observe and follow all instructions of the such orders rules directions and instructions for and concerning the Governor. settlement of Posts within the said Colony and the receiving and carrying of all Letters under this Act or Ordinance as the Governor or Acting Governor as aforesaid shall from time to time make and ordain and that every such Post Master Deputy Post Master or other They or other perperson or persons who shall wilfully open embezzle detain or delay shall wilfully open any Letter or Packet after the same shall be delivered into any of the embezzle detail or said Post Offices or into the hands of any person employed for the Packet shall be receiving or carrying thereof shall for every such offence be subject liable to the same principle and penalting and penalting and the pairs and the pairs. and liable to the same pains and penalties as persons guilty of opening as ensue in England. embezzling or detaining any Letter delivered into the General Post Office in England respectively are liable to by the laws and statutes in such case made and provided.

And be it further enacted That all Rates of Postage and sums Appropriation of all received for the conveying and delivering of Letters under and by received under this virtue of this Act or Ordinance shall be paid applied and accounted Act. for and disposed of in like manner as sums of money received under and by virtue of an Act of Council passed on the first day of November instant intituled "An Act to continue until further " provision shall be made certain Duties Tolls Rates Fees and other "Sums of Money imposed by the Governors of New South Wales and " for other purposes."
