An Act for applying certain Sums arising from the Appropriation. Revenue receivable in New South Wales to the Service of the said Colony for the Year One thousand eight hundred and thirty-two and for further appropriating the said Revenue. [21st March, 1832.]

WHEREAS by a certain Act of Parliament passed in the ninth Preamble. year of the reign of His late Majesty King George the Fourth intituled "An Act to provide for the Administration of Justice in New 9 Geo. IV. c. 83.
