An Act for applying certain Sums arising from the Revenue receivable in New South Wales to the Service thereof for the Year One thousand eight hundred and thirty-four and for further appropriating the said Revenue. [19th July, 1833.]

Preamble.

WHEREAS by a certain Act of Parliament passed in the ninth year of the reign of His late Majesty King George the Fourth intituled “*An Act to provide for the Administration of Justice in New South Wales and Van Diemen’s Land and for the more effectual Government thereof and for other purposes relating thereto*” it was amongst other things enacted That all and every the powers and authorities vested by certain other Acts of Parliament therein referred to or either of them in the Governor of New South Wales or the person administering the Government thereof should thenceforth be vested in and exercised by the said Governor acting with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council of the said Colony and that the produce of the several duties imposed and made payable under and by virtue of the said Acts therein referred to and also under and by virtue of that Act should be applied in such manner and to such purposes as the said Governor and Council should from time to time by any Law or Ordinance appoint Be it therefore enacted by His Excellency the Governor of New South Wales with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof That out of the produce of the said duties there shall and may be issued and applied any sum or sums of money not exceeding forty-five thousand five hundred and thirteen pounds seven shillings for defraying the charge of the Civil Establishment of New South Wales for the year one thousand eight hundred and thirty-four as hereinafter more particularly expressed that is to say any sum or sums of money not exceeding nine hundred and thirty pounds seven shillings and one penny to defray the salaries of the Officers and the contingent expenses of the Establishment of His Excellency the Governor and any sum or sums of money not exceeding eight hundred and six pounds two shillings and sixpence to defray the salaries of the Officers and the contingent expenses of the Department of the Executive and Legislative Councils and any sum or sums of money not exceeding four thousand four hundred and sixty-six pounds eleven shillings and threepence to defray the salaries of the Officers and the contingent expenses of the Department of the Colonial Secretary and any sum or sums of money not exceeding ten thousand six hundred and fifty pounds to defray the salaries of the Officers and Men and the contingent expenses of the Survey Department of the Surveyor General and any sum or sums of money not exceeding ten thousand three hundred and nineteen pounds fourteen shillings and twopence to defray the salaries of the Officers and Men and the contingent expenses of the Road Branch of the Surveyor General’s Department and any sum or sums of money not exceeding eight hundred and eight pounds seven shillings and sixpence to defray the salaries of the Officers and the contingent expenses of the Colonial Architect’s Branch of the Surveyor General’s Department and any sum or sums of money not exceeding one thousand two hundred and ninety-nine pounds twelve shillings and sixpence to defray the salaries of the Officers

And be it further enacted That out of the produce of the said duties there shall and may be issued and applied any sum or sums of money not exceeding thirteen thousand five hundred and thirty-four pounds twelve shillings and sixpence to defray the charge of the Judicial Establishment of the said Colony for the year one thousand eight hundred and thirty-four as hereinafter more particularly expressed that is to say any sum or sums of money not exceeding three thousand six hundred and sixty-four pounds and tenpence to defray the salaries of the Officers and the contingent expenses of the Establishment of the Supreme Court and any sum or sums of money not exceeding two thousand eight hundred and fifty-seven pounds fifteen shillings and tenpence to defray the salaries and contingent expenses of the Law Officers of the Crown and any sum or sums of money not exceeding two thousand six hundred and sixty pounds seventeen shillings and one penny to defray the salaries and allowances to the Officers and the contingent expenses of the Courts of Requests and any sum or sums of money not exceeding one thousand seven hundred and twenty pounds to defray the salaries and allowances to the Officers and the contingent expenses of the Courts of Quarter Sessions and any sum or sums of money not exceeding one thousand nine hundred and eleven pounds eighteen shillings and ninepence to defray the salaries and allowances to the Officers and the contingent expenses of the Department of the Sheriff and any sum or sums of money not exceeding

7. And be it further enacted That out of the produce of the said duties there shall and may be issued and applied any sum or sums of money not exceeding two thousand pounds to the Governor for the time-being of the said Colony to be applied to meet unforeseen expenses on occasions of emergency.

There shall also be issued and applied £2,000 to meet unforeseen expenses.

8. And be it further enacted That the Treasurer of the said Colony shall issue and pay the said several sums to such persons for the purposes hereinbefore mentioned upon such days and in such proportions as the Governor for the time-being by any warrant or order in writing to be signed by him shall from time to time order and direct and that the payments so to be made shall be charged upon and payable out of the Revenues of the said Colony.

Treasurer to pay the above at such times as the Governor by warrant shall order.

9. And be it further enacted That the said Treasurer shall in his accounts from time to time be allowed credit for any sum or sums of money paid by him in pursuance of such warrant or order in writing as aforesaid and that the receipt or receipts of the respective persons to whom the same shall be so paid shall be a full and valid discharge to the said Treasurer in passing his said accounts for any such sum or sums of money as shall be therein mentioned and that he shall and do receive credit for the same accordingly.

And to receive credit in his accounts for the payments made in pursuance thereof.
