WHEREAS by a certain Act of Parliament passed in the ninth year of the reign of His late Majesty King George the Fourth intituled "An Act to provide for the Administration of Jus-"tice in New South Wales and Van Diemen's Land and for the more "effectual Government thereof and for other purposes relating thereto"
