An Act for applying certain Sums arising from the Revenue receivable in New South Wales to the Service thereof for the Year One thousand eight hundred and thirty-six and for further appropriating the said Revenue. [25th August, 1835.]

APPROPRIATION.

WHEREAS by a certain Act of Parliament passed in the ninth year of the reign of His late Majesty King George the Fourth intituled "*An Act to provide for the Administration of Justice in New South Wales and Van Diemen's Land and for the more effectual Government thereof and other purposes relating thereto*" it was amongst other things enacted That all and every the powers and authorities vested by certain other Acts of Parliament therein referred to or either of them in the Governor of New South Wales or the person administering the Government thereof should thenceforth be vested in and exercised by the said Governor acting with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council of the said Colony and that the produce of the several duties imposed and made payable under and by virtue of the said recited Acts therein referred to and also under and by virtue of that Act should be applied in such manner and to such purposes as the said Governor and Council should from time to time by any Law or Ordinance appoint Be it therefore enacted by His Excellency the Governor of New South Wales with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof That out of the produce of the said duties there shall and may be issued and applied any sum or sums of money not exceeding ten thousand two hundred and one pounds seventeen shillings and ten-pence for the service of the year one thousand eight hundred and thirty-four to supply the deficiencies in the amount appropriated for the same.

2. And be it enacted That there shall and may be issued and applied any sum or sums of money not exceeding eight thousand pounds towards defraying the expenses incurred under the direction of His Majesty's Government for promoting the Emigration of free Persons from the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland to the Colony for the year one thousand eight hundred and thirty-five.

5. 14. And be it enacted That out of the produce of the said duties there shall and may be issued and applied any sum or sums of money not exceeding two thousand pounds to the Governor for the time-being of the said Colony to be applied to meet unforeseen expenses on occasions of emergency for the year one thousand eight hundred and thirty-six.

15. And be it enacted That the Treasurer of the said Colony shall issue and pay the said several sums to such persons for the purposes hereinbefore mentioned upon such days and in such proportions as the Governor for the time-being by any warrant or order in writing to be signed by him shall from time to time order and direct and that the payments so to be made shall be made upon and payable out of the Revenues of the said Colony.

16. And be it enacted That the said Treasurer shall in his accounts from time to time be allowed credit for any sum or sums of money paid by him in pursuance of such warrant or order in writing as aforesaid and that the receipt or receipts of the respective persons to whom the same shall be so paid shall be a full and valid discharge to the said Treasurer in passing his said accounts for any such sum or sums as shall be therein mentioned and that he shall and do receive credit for the same accordingly.
