An Act for applying certain sums arising from the Revenue receivable in New South Wales to the Service thereof for the Year One thousand eight hundred and thirty-seven and for further appropriating the said Revenue. [5th August, 1836.]

APPROPRIATION.

WHIEREAS by a certain Act of Parliament passed in the ninth year of the reign of His late Majesty King George the Fourth intituled “ *An Act to provide for the Administration of Justice in New South Wales and Van Diemen’s Land and for the more effectual Government thereof and for other purposes relating thereto* ” it was amongst other things enacted That all and every the powers and authorities vested by certain other Acts of Parliament therein referred to or either of them in the Governor of New South Wales or the person administering the Government thereof should thenceforth be vested in and exercised by the said Governor acting with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council of the said Colony and that the produce of the several duties imposed and made payable under and by virtue of the said recited Acts therein referred to and also under and by virtue of that Act should be applied in such manner and to such purposes as the said Governor and Council should from time to time by any Law or Ordinance appoint Be it therefore enacted by His Excellency the Governor of New South Wales with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof That out of the excess of the amount appropriated out of the produce of the said duties for the service of the year one thousand eight hundred and thirty-five there shall and may be issued and applied any sum or sums of money not exceeding eleven thousand one hundred and ninety pounds eighteen shillings and eight-pence to supply the deficiencies in the amount appropriated for certain departments for that year.

And be it enacted That the Treasurer of the said Colony shall issue and pay the said several sums to such persons for the purposes hereinbefore mentioned upon such days and in such proportions as the Governor for the time-being by any warrant or order in writing to be signed by him shall from time to time order and direct and that the payments so to be made shall be charged upon and payable out of the Revenues of the said Colony.

Treasurer to pay the above at such times as the Governor by warrant shall order.

14. And be it enacted That the said Treasurer shall in his accounts from time to time be allowed credit for any sum or sums of money paid by him in pursuance of such warrant or order in writing as aforesaid and that the receipt or receipts of the respective persons to whom the same shall be so paid shall be a full and valid discharge to the said Treasurer in passing his said accounts for any such sum or sums as shall be therein mentioned and that he shall and do receive credit for the same accordingly.

And to receive credit in his accounts for the payments made in pursuance thereof.
