An Act for applying certain Sums arising from the Revenue receivable in New South Wales to the Service thereof for the Year One thousand eight hundred and forty-one and for further appropriating the said Revenue. [16th October, 1840.]

Appropriation (1841.)

WHEREAS by a certain Act of Parliament passed in the ninth Preamble. year of the reign of His late Majesty King George the Fourth intituled "An Act to provide for the Administration of Justice in New 9 Gco. IV. c. 83.
