WHEREAS by an Act of the Governor and Council of New South Preamble.

to provide for the conveyance and postage of Letters" provision is made
by the Schedule thereunto annexed for a charge of four-pence as the
postage demandable on every letter or packet weighing less than half
an ounce forwarded by sea from one port of the Colony of New South

Wales to another and whereas since the passing of the said recited

Packets and letters conveyed by steamers between Sydney and Port Phillip to be liable to the same postage by land.

Act Post Office communication by steamer between Sydney and Port Phillip has become frequent and it is expedient to increase the rate of postage on letters and packets transmitted by steamers plying between Sydney and Port Phillip Be it therefore enacted by His Excellency the Governor of New South Wales with the advice of the Legislative Council thereof That from and after the passing of this Act the rate of postage to be demanded and taken for conveyance of packets and as letters transmitted letters by steamers between Sydney and the District of Port Phillip shall be the same in amount as is now or may hereafter be demanded and taken for transmission of packets and letters between the said places by land.
