An Act for applying certain Sums arising from the Revenue receivable in New South Wales to the Service thereof for the Year One thousand eight hundred and forty-two and for further appropriating the said Revenue. [8th September, 1841.]

APPROPRIATION (1842).

WIIEREAS by a certain Act of Parliament passed in the ninth year Preamble. of the reign of His late Majesty King George the Fourth intituled "An Act to provide for the Administration of Justice in New South 9 George IV. c. 83.
