APPROPRIATION
(1843).

An Act for applying certain sums arising from the Revenue receivable in New South Wales to the Service thereof for the Year One thousand eight hundred and forty-three and for further appropriating the said Revenue. [30th August, 1842.]

Preamble. **W**HEREAS by a certain Act of Parliament passed in the ninth year of the reign of His late Majesty King George the Fourth intituled "*An Act to provide for the Administration of Justice in New South Wales and Van Diemen's Land and for the more effectual Government thereof and for other purposes relating thereto*" it was among other things enacted that all and every the powers and authorities vested by certain other Acts of Parliament therein referred to or either of them in the Governor of New South Wales or the person administering the Government thereof should thenceforth be vested in and exercised by the said Governor acting with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council of the said Colony and that the produce of the several duties imposed and made payable under and by virtue of the said recited Acts therein referred to and also under and by virtue of that Act should be applied in such manner and to such purposes as the said Governor and Council should from time to time by any Law or Ordinance appoint Be it therefore enacted by His Excellency the Governor of New South Wales with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof That out of the sum of one hundred and twenty-eight thousand and seventy-five pounds five shillings and seven-pence being the excess of the amount appropriated for the service of the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-one there shall and may be issued and applied any sum or sums of money not exceeding twenty-nine thousand two hundred and twenty-five pounds sixteen shillings and ten-pence to supply the deficiencies in the amount appropriated for certain Departments and Services for that year.
