An Act for applying certain Sums arising from the Revenue receivable in New South Wales to the Supplementary Service thereof for the Year One thousand eight hundred and forty-[30th August, 1844.]

APPROPRIATION (1844).

WHEREAS by a certain Act of Parliament passed in the fifth and Preamble. sixth year of the reign of Her present Majesty Queen Victoria intituled "An Act for the Government of New South Wales and 5 and 6 Vic. cap. 76.
