APPROPRIATION (1845).

An Act for applying certain Sums arising from the Revenue receivable in New South Wales to the Service thereof for the Year One thousand eight hundred and forty-five and for further appropriating the said Revenue. [20th December, 1844.

Preamble.

HEREAS by a certain Act of Parliament passed in the fifth and sixth year of the reign of Her present Majesty Queen Victoria intituled "An Act for the Government of New South Wales and Van Diemen's Land" it was among other things enacted that the Governor of the said Colony of New South Wales with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council should have authority to make laws for the peace welfare and good government of the said Colony and that with the deductions and subject to the provisions therein contained the whole of Her Majesty's Revenue within the said Colony arising from taxes duties rates and imposts levied on Her Majesty's subjects within the said Colony should be appropriated to the public service within the said Colony by Ordinances to be for that purpose enacted by His Excellency the Governor of New South Wales with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council of the said Colony and in no other manner Be it therefore enacted by His Excellency the Governor of New South Wales with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof That out of the produce of the said taxes duties rates and imposts there shall and may be issued and applied any sum or sums of money not exceeding forty-four thousand two hundred and thirty-two pounds ten shillings and three-Civil and Legislative pence to defray the charge of the Civil and Legislative Establishments Establishments viz. of New South Wales unprovided for by Schedule B of the said recited Act of Parliament for the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-five
