An Act for applying certain Sums arising from the Revenue receivable in New South Wales to the Service thereof for the Year One thousand eight hundred and forty-seven and for further appropriating the said Revenue. [30th October, 1846.]

APPROPRIATION
(1847).

WHEREAS by a certain Act of Parliament passed in the fifth and sixth year of the reign of Her present Majesty Queen Victoria intituled "*An Act for the Government of New South Wales and Van Diemen's Land*" it was among other things enacted that the Governor of the said Colony of New South Wales with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council should have authority to make laws for the peace welfare and good government of the said Colony and that with the deductions and subject to the provisions therein contained the whole of Her Majesty's Revenue within the said Colony arising from taxes duties rates and imposts levied on Her Majesty's subjects within the said Colony should be appropriated to the public service within the said Colony by Ordinances to be for that purpose enacted by the Governor with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council of the said Colony and in no other manner Be it therefore enacted by His Excellency the Governor of New South Wales with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof That out of the produce of the said taxes duties rates and imposts there shall and may be issued and applied any sum or sums of money not exceeding thirty-three thousand three hundred and fifty-eight pounds fifteen shillings and four-pence to defray the charge of the Civil and Legislative Establishments of New South Wales unprovided for by Schedule B of the said recited Act of Parliament for the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-seven as hereinafter more particularly expressed that is to say any sum or sums of money not exceeding six hundred and twenty pounds eighteen shillings and nine-pence to defray the expense of the Establishment of His Excellency the Governor and any sum or sums of money not exceeding three thousand five hundred and seventy-five pounds fourteen shillings and three-pence to defray the expense of the Establishment of the Legislative Council and any sum or sums of money not exceeding nine hundred and seventy-five pounds seven shillings and nine-pence to defray the expense of the Establishment of the Registrar General and any sum or sums of money not exceeding

And be it enacted That the Treasurer of the said Colony shall issue and pay the said several sums to such persons for the purposes hereinbefore mentioned upon such days and in such proportions as the Governor for the time being by any warrant or order in writing to be signed by him shall from time to time order and direct and that the payments so to be made shall be charged upon and payable out of the Revenues of the said Colony.

And be it enacted That the said Treasurer shall in his accounts from time to time be allowed credit for any sum or sums of money paid by him in pursuance of such warrant or order in writing as aforesaid and that the receipt or receipts of the respective persons to whom the same shall be so paid shall be a full and valid discharge to the said Treasurer in passing his said accounts for any such sum or sums as shall be therein mentioned and that he shall and do receive credit for the same accordingly.
