An Act for applying certain Sums arising from the Revenue receivable in New South Wales to the Service thereof for the Year One thousand eight hundred and forty-nine and for further appropriating the said Revenue. [16th June, 1848.]

Preamble.

WHEREAS by a certain Act of Parliament passed in the fifth and sixth year of the reign of Her present Majesty Queen Victoria intituled "*An Act for the Government of New South Wales and Van Diemen's Land*" it was among other things enacted that the Governor of the said Colony of New South Wales with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council should have authority to make laws for the peace welfare and good government of the said Colony and that with the deductions and subject to the provisions therein contained the whole of Her Majesty's Revenue within the said Colony arising from taxes duties rates and imposts levied on Her Majesty's subjects within the said Colony should be appropriated to the public service within the said Colony by Ordinances to be for that purpose enacted by the Governor with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council

11. And be it enacted That out of the produce of the assessment to arise from an Act passed by the said Governor and Legislative Council in the eleventh year of the reign of Her said Majesty intituled "*An Act to authorize for a limited time an Assessment upon Stock pastured beyond the Settled Districts of New South Wales*" there shall and may be issued and applied any sum or sums of money not exceeding two thousand nine hundred and twenty-five pounds to defray the supplementary charge on the Colonial Treasury for the districts beyond the Settled Districts of the said Colony for the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-eight as hereinafter more particularly expressed that is to say any sum or sums of money not exceeding one thousand pounds to defray the expense of the Conveyance of Mails beyond the Settled Districts in the Sydney District and any sum or sums of money not exceeding nine hundred and twenty-five pounds to defray the expense of the Conveyance of Mails beyond the Settled Districts in the Port Phillip District and any sum or sums of money not exceeding one thousand pounds to defray the expense of a small corps of Native Police to be employed beyond the Settled Districts in the Sydney District.

12. And be it enacted That the Treasurer of the said Colony shall issue and pay the said several sums to such persons for the purposes hereinbefore mentioned upon such days and in such proportions as the Governor for the time-being by any warrant or order in writing to be signed by him shall from time to time order and direct and that the payments so to be made shall be charged upon and payable out of the Revenues of the said Colony.

13. And be it enacted That the said Treasurer shall in his accounts from time to time be allowed credit for any sum or sums of money paid by him in pursuance of such warrant or order in writing as aforesaid and that the receipt or receipts of the respective persons to whom the same shall be so paid shall be a full and valid discharge to the said Treasurer in passing his said accounts for any such sum or sums as shall be therein mentioned and that he shall and do receive credit for the same accordingly.
