An Act to amend the "Act for regulating the

" Police in the Towns of Parramatta Windsor

- " Maitland Bathurst and other Towns respectively
- " and for removing and preventing Nuisances
- " and Obstructions and for the better alignment of Streets therein." [15th June, 1848].

HEREAS by an Act of the Governor and Council passed in the Preamble. second year of the reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria intituled "An Act for regulating the Police in the Towns of Parra- 2 Vic. No. 2. " matta Windsor Maitland Bathurst and other Towns respectively and " for removing and preventing Nuisances and Obstructions and for the "better alignment of Streets therein" it was amongst other things enacted that it should be lawful for the Governor from time to time by warrant under his hand to appoint a Justice of the Peace to execute the duties of Police Magistrate within each of the said towns specified in the said Act as well as within each of such other towns in the Colony of New South Wales as should be declared by His Excellency the Governor by proclamation to come under the operation of the said Act together with such other duties as should be specified in the said Act or as should be from time to time directed by the Governor for the more efficient administration of the Police within the limits of the said towns respectively under the authority of the said Act or any other Act or Ordinance in force within the said Colony And whereas it is expedient that all such powers and authorities as may have been conferred on the Justices so appointed by the Governor to execute the duties of Police Magistrate in each of the said towns respectively should in certain cases be extended to and conferred on certain other Justices of the Peace Be it therefore enacted by His Excellency the Governor of New South Wales with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof That from Justices in certain and after the passing of this Act every Justice of the Peace shall have cases to perform the duties of Police all the same powers and authorities within the limits of any of the Magistrates. said country towns of the said Colony in or night to which he has heretofore been or shall hereafter be in the habit of residing as he would have had before the passing of this Act if he had been duly appointed by the Governor to execute the duties of Police Magistrate within such town Provided nevertheless that this Act shall not be deemed to apply to any such town as aforesaid in which there may now or shall hereafter be a duly appointed Police Magistrate in the

performance of the duties imposed by the said recited Act.
