 ABSCONDING
 DEBTORS.

An Act to prevent the escape from the Colony of fraudulent Debtors. [27th July, 1849.]

Preamble.

Certain writs may
 be executed upon
 Sunday in like man-
 ner as they may now
 be executed upon any
 other day of the
 week.

WHEREAS by reason of the law that no person can be arrested on any civil process on a Sunday many fraudulent Debtors evade payment of their Debts and escape from the Colony For remedy whereof Be it therefore enacted by His Excellency the Governor of New South Wales with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof That any writ of *capias ad respondendum* or of *capias ad satisfaciendum* issued or to be issued out of the Supreme Court of the said Colony at Sydney or the Supreme Court of the said Colony for the District of Port Phillip and any precept in the nature of a writ of *capias ad satisfaciendum* issued or to be issued out of any Court of Requests in and for any part of the said Colony shall and may respectively be lawfully executed upon a Sunday in like manner in all respects as the same respectively may now be executed upon any other day any law statute or usage to the contrary in anywise notwithstanding.
