An Act for applying certain Sums arising from the Revenue receivable in New South Wales to the Service thereof for the Year One thousand eight hundred and fifty-two and for further appropriating the said Revenue. [22nd December, 1851.]

Appropriation (1852).

WHEREAS by a certain Act of Parliament passed in the fifth and Preamble. sixth year of the reign of Her present Majesty Queen Victoria intituled "An Act for the Government of New South Wales and Van 5 and 6 vic. c. 76. Diemen's Land" it was among other things enacted that the Governor of the said Colony of New South Wales with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council should have authority to make laws for the peace welfare and good government of the said Colony and that with the deductions and subject to the provisions therein contained the whole of Her Majesty's Revenue within the said Colony arising from taxes duties rates and imposts levied on Her Majesty's subjects within the said Colony should be appropriated to the public service within the said Colony by Ordinances to be for that purpose enacted by the Governor with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council of the said Colony and in no other manner And whereas by a certain other
