An Act for applying certain Sums arising from the Revenue receivable in New South Wales to the Service thereof for the Year One thousand eight hundred and fifty-three and for further appropriating the said Revenue. [27th December, 1852.]

WHEREAS by a certain Act of Parliament passed in the fifth and sixth year of the reign of Her present Majesty Queen Victoria intituled "*An Act for the Government of New South Wales and Van Diemen's Land*" it was among other things enacted that the Governor of the said Colony of New South Wales with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council should have authority to make laws for the peace welfare and good government of the said Colony and that with the deductions and subject to the provisions therein contained the whole of Her Majesty's Revenue within the said Colony arising from taxes duties rates and imposts levied on Her Majesty's subjects within the said Colony should be appropriated to the public service within the said Colony by Ordinances to be for that purpose enacted by the Governor with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council of the said Colony and in no other manner And whereas by a certain other Act of Parliament passed in the thirteenth and fourteenth year of the reign of Her said Majesty intituled "*An Act for the better Government of Her Majesty's Australian Colonies*"

Colonies” it was amongst other things enacted that after the establishment of the Colony of Victoria so much of the said first recited Act as made payable to Her Majesty Her Heirs and Successors out of the Revenue Fund of the said Colony of New South Wales the sums therein mentioned for defraying the expenses of the services and purposes named in the Schedules thereto annexed should be repealed and that in lieu thereof there should be payable to Her Majesty every year out of the Revenue Funds arising from taxes duties rates and imposts levied within the said Colony of New South Wales after the establishment of the Colony of Victoria as aforesaid the several sums mentioned in the Schedule (A) to the said second recited Act annexed And whereas the Colony of Victoria hath been established in manner provided by the said second recited Act Be it therefore enacted by His Excellency the Governor of New South Wales with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof as follows:—
