An Act for applying certain Sums out of the Consolidated Revenues of New South Wales to the Service thereof for the Year One thousand eight hundred and fifty-six and for further appropriating the said Revenues. [18th December, 1855.]

Preamble. THEREAS by the Act of the Governor and Legislative Council of New South Wales passed in the seventeenth year of Her Majesty's reign intituled "An Act to confer a Constitution on New "South Wales and to grant a Civil List to Her Majesty" as amended by the authority of the Imperial Parliament and assented to by Her Majesty it is amongst other things enacted that the Consolidated Revenue Fund in the said Act mentioned shall (after and subject to the payments to be made under certain provisions in the said Act contained and subject to certain charges therein mentioned) be subject to be appropriated to such specific purposes as by any Act of the Legislature of the Colony shall be prescribed in that behalf Be it therefore enacted by His Excellency the Governor of New South Wales with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof as follows :-

The Treasurer of the said Colony shall issue and pay the said several sums to such persons for the purposes hereinbefore mentioned upon such days and in such proportions as the Governor for the time being by any warrant or order in writing to be signed by him shall from time to time order and direct and the payments so to be made shall be charged upon and payable out of the said Consolidated Revenue Fund.

29. The said Treasurer shall in his Accounts from time to time be allowed credit for any sum or sums of money paid by him in pursuance of such warrant or order in writing as aforesaid and the receipt or receipts of the respective persons to whom the same shall be so paid shall be a full and valid discharge to the said Treasurer in passing his said Accounts for any such sum or sums as shall be therein mentioned and he shall and do receive credit for the same accordingly.
