An Act to remove doubts respecting Tolls upon Public Bridges. [3rd December, 1861.]

WHEREAS it is expedient to remove doubts as to the intention Preamble. of the Legislature relating to Tolls upon Public Bridges Be it therefore declared and enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled and by the authority of the same as follows:—

1. The several powers and authorities and all other the pro-Turnpike or Ferry visions of the Act second William the Fourth number twelve relating Tolls to mean also Public Bridge Tolls. to Turnpike Gates and Ferries Turnpike Tolls and Ferry Dues as amended by the "Main Roads Management Act of 1858" and the 21 Vie. No. 8. several provisions of the last-mentioned Act relating to the same matters do apply and shall be deemed in law to apply to all Bridges in the Colony constructed repaired or maintained at the public expense or

Insolvency.

or being public property and to all Bridge Tolls and Dues thereon or in respect thereof as fully and effectually and in like manner as if such Bridges Bridge Tolls and Dues were in terms mentioned or referred to in and by such Acts respectively.

Public Bridges over boundary rivers.

2. This Act shall be held to extend and apply to any Public Bridge crossing a river which forms part of the boundary line between this and any other Colony Provided that as to any such Bridge being the joint property of the two Colonies any arrangement may be made between the Governments of such two Colonies respecting the collection division and appropriation of the Bridge Tolls and Dues thereon.

Short title.

3. This Act shall be styled and may be cited as the "Public Bridges Tolls Act of 1861."
