PARRAMATTA
FACTORY-STREET.

An Act to authorize the enclosure of a portion of Factory-street in the Town of Parramatta. [9th October, 1867.]

Preamble.

WHEREAS it is expedient that the portion hereinafter described of the street known as Factory-street in the Town of Parramatta should be stopped as a public highway and that the right of way thereover hitherto enjoyed by the public should be legally extinguished and that Her Majesty should be enabled to alienate or otherwise deal with the land forming such portion of the said street as hereinafter described free and clear of such right of way Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled and by the authority of the same as follows :—

1. It shall be lawful for the Surveyor General to cause to be enclosed so much of that piece of land being the south-westerly prolongation of Factory-street in the Town of Parramatta (the alignment of which street under the Act second Victoria number two was notified in the *Government Gazette* of the thirty-first January one thousand eight hundred and sixty) as extends from the left bank of the Parramatta River along the north-western wall of the Factory to the Old Mill-race And from and after such enclosure all right of way over the said piece of land shall be for ever extinguished and such portion so enclosed may free and clear of such right of way be used enjoyed alienated or otherwise dealt with by Her Majesty Her Heirs and Successors.
