POLICE REGULATION
EXTENSION.

An Act to remove doubts as to the operation of
and jurisdiction conferred by the Act 19 Vict.
No. 24 at places other than Towns. [*24th*
March, 1869.]

Preamble.

WHEREAS doubts have arisen whether the Act nineteenth Victoria number twenty-four extends to all places within the Colony of New South Wales and it is expedient to extend the provisions of the said Act to all places whether proclaimed Towns or otherwise within the said Colony Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled and by the authority of the same as follows :—

1. So much of the Act nineteenth Victoria number twenty-four, as is now in force within certain towns and places shall extend and apply to and be in operation in all parts of the Colony.
