(Consolidated Fund) Appropriation. An Act to appropriate and apply out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund of New South Wales certain sums to make good the Supplies granted for the Service of the Year 1891, and for the Year 1890 and previous Years. [20th December, 1890.]

Preamble.

THEREAS we Your Majesty's most dutiful and loyal subjects, the Members of the Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, have granted to Your Majesty the several sums hereinafter mentioned for the service of the year one thousand eight hundred and ninety-one, and for supplementing the grants made by the present Parliament, in its Second Session, for the service of the year one thousand eight hundred and ninety and for previous And whereas we desire to make good out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund of New South Wales the several sums granted to Your Majesty as aforesaid. Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, that out of the said Consolidated Revenue Fund there shall be further appropriated, and are hereby appropriated, and shall be issued and applied for or towards the several uses and purposes hereafter expressed—

Treasurer shall pay by warrant or order.

XIII. The Treasurer of the said Colony shall issue and pay the said several sums to such persons for the purposes hereinbefore mentioned in such manner and in such proportions as the Governor by any warrant or order in writing under his hand and directed to the said Treasurer shall from time to time order and direct, and the payments so to be made shall be charged upon and payable out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund of the said Colony.

Treasurer shall be allowed credit for moneys paid by him.

XIV. The said Treasurer shall in his Accounts from time to time be allowed credit for any sum or sums of money paid by him in pursuance of such warrant or order in writing as aforesaid, and the receipt or receipts of the respective persons to whom the same shall be so paid shall be a full and valid discharge to the said Treasurer in passing his said Accounts for any such sum or sums as shall be therein mentioned, and he shall receive credit for the same accordingly.

No appropriation to lapse till 31 December, 1892. XV. No appropriation included in this Act shall lapse until the thirty-first day of December, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-two

Provisions of Audit Act not affected. XVI. Nothing in this Act contained shall affect or in any manner alter or vary any of the provisions contained in the Act thirty-three Victoria number eighteen, intituled the "Audit Act of 1870"

Short title.

XVII. This Act may be cited as the "Appropriation Act of 1891."
