**An Act to sanction the erection of a Hospital** KENMORE HOSPITAL  
FOR INSANE.  
**for the Insane at Kenmore, near Goulburn.**  
 [13th November, 1894.]

**W**HEREAS, pursuant to and in accordance with the provisions of Preamble.  
 the Public Works Act of 1888, a certain proposed Public Work, namely, Hospital for the Insane at Kenmore, near Goulburn, was, on the thirty-first day of March, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-two, submitted and explained by the Secretary for Public Works in the Legislative Assembly, and the said work (called in the motion "Lunatic Asylum at Kenmore, near Goulburn") was thereupon referred, on the motion of the said Secretary, to the Parliamentary Standing Committee on Public Works for their report thereon, which Committee reported to the said Assembly the result of their inquiries: And whereas, after the receipt of the said report, that is to say on the fifth day of September, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-four, the said Assembly by resolution declared that it was expedient that the said work should be carried out; which resolution was notified in the *Gazette*, on the seventh day of September, in the year last-mentioned: Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. The carrying out of the said work more particularly described Work sanctioned.  
 in the Schedule to this Act is hereby sanctioned; and the Secretary for Public Works, or the Member of the Executive Council for the time being performing the duties of the said Secretary, is hereby authorised to undertake and carry out the said work subject to the provisions of this Act, and for that purpose shall be and shall have the powers and duties of a Constructing Authority within the meaning of the Public Works Act of 1888. The plan of the said work, subject however to such modifications as may from time to time be found necessary in the carrying out of the work, is the plan marked "Hospital for Insane, Kenmore," signed by the Secretary for Public Works and counter-signed by the Government Architect, and deposited in the office of the said Secretary.

2. The cost of carrying out the work hereby sanctioned, Cost, how to be  
defrayed.  
 estimated at one hundred and fifty thousand pounds, may be defrayed from such Loan Votes as are now or may hereafter be applicable thereto.

3. This Act may be cited as the "Kenmore Hospital for the Short title.  
 Insane Act, 1894."

## SCHEDULE.

The proposed works comprise all necessary buildings for the patients proposed to be accommodated, together with the necessary kitchens, laundries, workshops, recreation hall, residences, and quarters for Medical Superintendents, and other necessary officials. Also all works in connection with sewage, irrigation, drainage, water reticulation, boundary and other fencing, entrance and other gates; and such other works as may be found necessary.
