# No. XIII.

An Act to appropriate and apply out of the (Consolidated Appropriate Appropria Consolidated Revenue Fund of New South Wales certain Sums to make good the Supplies granted for the Service of the period from the 1st day of January to the 30th day of June, 1895, inclusive of both dates, and for the Year 1894 and previous Years; and for purposes connected with and incidental to the above objects. [22nd *December*. 1894. ]

WHEREAS we Your Majesty's most dutiful and loyal subjects, Preamble. the Members of the Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, have granted to Your Majesty the several sums hereinafter mentioned for the service of the period from the first day of January to the thirtieth day of June of the year one thousand eight hundred and ninety-five (inclusive of both dates), and for supplementing the grants made by the last Parliament, in its Fourth Session, for the service of the year one thousand eight hundred and ninetyfour and for previous years : And whereas we desire to make good out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund of New South Wales the several sums granted to Your Majesty as aforesaid : Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, that out of the said Consolidated Revenue Fund there shall be further appropriated, and are hereby appropriated, and shall be issued and applied for or towards the several uses and purposes hereafter expressed-

The Treasurer of the said Colony shall issue and pay the Treasurer shall pay said several sums to such persons for the purposes hereinbefore men-<sup>by</sup> warrant or order. tioned in such manner and in such proportions as the Governor by any warrant or order in writing under his hand and directed to the said Treasurer shall from time to time order and direct, and the payments so to be made shall be charged upon and payable out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund of the said Colony.

XIV. The said Treasurer shall in his Accounts from time to Treasurer shall be time be allowed credit for any sum or sums of money paid by him in allowed credit for pursuance of such warrant or order in writing as aforesaid, and the receipt or receipts of the respective persons to whom the same shall be so paid shall be a full and valid discharge to the said Treasurer in passing his said Accounts for any such sum or sums as shall be therein mentioned, and he shall receive credit for the same accordingly.

XV. Notwithstanding anything in the "Appropriation Act of Extension of time 1893" to the contrary the balance unexpended of the vote for that for expenditure of balance of a vote. year on account of Endowment to Boroughs, Municipal Districts and Shires shall be available for expenditure on the Roads and Bridges of the Colony until the thirty-first day of December, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-five.

XVI. No appropriation included in this Act shall lapse until the No appropriation thirtieth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-six. to lapse till 30th June, 1896.

XVII. Nothing in this Act contained shall affect or in any Provisions of Audit manner alter or vary any of the provisions contained in the Act Act not affected. thirty-three Victoria number eighteen, intituled the "Audit Act of 1870."

XVIII. This Act may be cited as the "Appropriation Act of Short title. 1895."
