AUSTRALASIAN
FEDERATION
(REPRESENTATIVES'
ALLOWANCE).

An Act to authorise the payment of allowances to the Representatives of New South Wales at the Federal Convention. [13th November, 1897.]

BE it enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

Allowances to

1. Every representative of New South Wales at the Convention constituted by the Australasian Federation Enabling Act, 1895, shall be entitled to receive, by way of reimbursement of expenses incurred by him

him at and incidental to the sitting of that Convention at Adelaide, an allowance at the rate of two guineas for every day that he remained at Adelaide during the said sitting, and for every day necessarily spent by him in going to and returning from the said sitting. All such expenses shall be a charge upon and be paid out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund, a special appropriation from which is hereby made for that purpose :

Provided that nothing in this Act shall constitute any of the said representatives the holder of an office of profit under the Crown.

2. This Act may be cited as the "Australasian Federation Short title.
(Representatives' Allowance) Act, 1897."
