An Act to amend the Australasian Federation

ENABLING ACT
AMENDMENT.

WHEREAS it is desirable to conserve to the electors of New South Wales the principle of Government by majority, and to amend the Australasian Federation Enabling Act of 1895 in so far as it provides for the acceptance by the electors of New South Wales of a Federal Constitution: Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the "Australasian Federation Enabling Act Amendment Act of 1897." Short title.

2. That the thirty-fifth clause of the Australasian Federation Enabling Act of 1895 shall be amended by the omission of the words "than fifty thousand" and in lieu thereof the insertion of the words "than eighty thousand."
