An Act to provide that the expression “noxious animals” in the Pastures and Stock Protection Act, 1898, shall include rabbits.

PASTURES AND
STOCK PROTECTION
(RABBIT).

BE it enacted by the Queen’s Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the “Pastures and Stock Protection (Rabbit) Act, 1900.” Short title.

2. The expression “noxious animals” in the Pastures and Stock Protection Act, 1898, shall include rabbits. Noxious animals to include rabbits.

3. Nothing in this Act shall interfere with or derogate from the provisions of the Rabbit Act of 1890. Not to affect Rabbit Act.
