ADVANCES TO SETTLERS (AMENDMENT).

An Act to amend the Advances to Settlers Acts. [22nd December, 1902.]

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Logislative Council. the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:-

Short title.

Act, 1899.

1. This Act may be cited as the "Advances to Settlers (Amendment) Act, 1902," and shall be read with the Advances to Settlers Act, 1899, and the Advances to Settlers (Amendment) Act, 1901.

Amendment of section 4 of Advances to Settlers

2. Section one of the Advances to Settlers Act, 1899, is amended section 1 of Advances by substituting the word "ten" for the word "five" in that section.

Amendment of 3. Section four of the Advances to Settlers Act, 1899, is

amended by the omission of the words "at a rate not exceeding three and a half pounds per annum for every one hundred pounds" and substituting therefor the words "in respect."

Amount of advance.

4. An advance may be made under section nine of the Advances to Settlers Act, 1899, to an amount not exceeding one thousand five hundred pounds; and subsection (d) of that section is hereby amended accordingly.

Wine Adulteration.

5. The rate of interest payable in respect of any advance made Rate of interest. after the passing of this Act shall be not less than four per centum per annum, and subsection (e) of section nine of the Advances to Settlers Act, 1899, is hereby amended accordingly.
