

Act No. 45, 1902.

An Act to consolidate the enactments relating to the vesting of certain land in the Agricultural Society of New South Wales, subject to certain conditions, and the suspension of all rights of common in respect of such land. [21st August, 1902.]

AGRICULTURAL
SOCIETY.

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows :—

1. This Act may be cited as the "Agricultural Society Act, Short title. 1902."

2. The Acts mentioned in the First Schedule hereto are, to the extent therein expressed, hereby repealed.

3. The land described in the Second Schedule hereto shall, subject to the conditions hereinafter contained, be deemed to have been vested and vest in the Agricultural Society of New South Wales for a period of twenty-one years from and after the thirtieth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-four, and all rights of common in respect of the said lands are hereby suspended during such period.

4. (1) The said society may occupy and use the said land for the purpose of holding shows and exhibitions of agricultural, horticultural, and pastoral produce, implements and machinery, of minerals, of arts and manufactures, and of live stock, and for such other purposes as the Minister may sanction, and shall admit the public thereto, subject to such charges and conditions as shall be approved by the Minister, provided always that no horse-races or pony-races shall be held on the said land.

(2) The said society shall at all times keep the said land clean and free from manure and other offensive matter to the satisfaction of the city engineer or such other person as the Minister may appoint.

5. If the said society fail to comply with the provisions of section four, or if the said land be used or occupied for any purpose whatsoever save as hereinbefore provided, or if the said society sell, lease, mortgage, assign, charge, or otherwise deal with or dispose of the said land or any part thereof, or attempt to do so, or do or suffer any act or thing whereby any part of the said land or of the profits thereof shall vest in or become payable to any other person by operation of law or otherwise, or whereby the same would, but for the provisions of this section, so vest or become payable, or if the said land be taken in execution, or if the said society cease to exist, the said land shall, upon notification to that effect in the Gazette, revest in His Majesty.

SECOND SCHEDULE.

All that piece or parcel of land containing by admeasurement forty acres thirty perches, be the same more or less, situated in the county of Cumberland, parish of Alexandria: Commencing at the south-western corner of the Association Cricket Ground, Moore Park, dedicated thirty-first July, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-seven; and bounded thence on the north by the southern boundary of the said cricket ground bearing north seventy-five degrees fifty-seven minutes and nineteen seconds east nine chains eighty-eight and eight-tenths links; thence on part of the west by the eastern boundary of the cricket ground and its northerly extension, being in all a line bearing north thirteen degrees fifty-six minutes and forty-one seconds west twelve chains forty-seven and seven-tenths links to the south-west boundary of the ground appropriated for volunteer rifle range; thence on the north-east by part of the said

said boundary of that ground bearing south fifty-five degrees thirty-seven minutes and thirty-eight seconds east twenty-three chains sixty-three and seven-tenths links to the western side of Cook Road; thence on the east by that side of that road bearing south two degrees fifty-six minutes and fifteen seconds east five chains and fifteen and seven-tenths links; thence on the south-east by the north-western side of the aforesaid Cook Road, and a line in all bearing south fifty-seven degrees one minute west fifteen chains sixty-eight and nine-tenths links; thence on the south by a line bearing south seventy-five degrees thirty-five minutes twenty-seven seconds west five chains seventy-five and nine-tenths links; thence on the south-west by six chains thirty-one and six-tenths links on an arc of four chains radius tangential to the last described boundary and curving to the west and north; and thence on the remainder of the west by a line bearing north thirteen degrees fifty-six minutes and forty-five seconds west eleven chains thirty-eight and a half links, to the point of commencement,—as shown on plan catalogued Ms. 692, Sy., Department of Lands.
