The Colonial Treasurer shall issue and pay the said several Treasurer shall pay sums to such persons for the purposes hereinbefore mentioned in such by warrant or order. manner and in such proportions as the Governor by any warrant or order in writing under his hand and directed to the said Treasurer may from time to time order and direct, and the payments so to be made shall be charged upon and payable out of the said funds respectively; but the said Treasurer shall not be held liable for any claims which may arise in connection with any of the State Departments transferred to the Commonwealth on or after the date of such transfer.
- 5. The said Treasurer shall in his Accounts from time to time Treasurer shall be be allowed credit for any sum or sums of money paid by him in allowed credit for moneys paid by him. pursuance of such warrant or order in writing as aforesaid, and the receipt or receipts of the respective persons to whom the same are so paid shall be a full and valid discharge to the said Treasurer in passing his said Accounts for any such sum or sums as may be therein mentioned, and he shall receive credit for the same accordingly.
