WHEREAS

Preamble.

MEREAS we Your Majesty's most dutiful and loyal subjects, the Members of the Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, have granted to Your Majesty the several sums hereinafter mentioned for the service of the year from the first day of July, one thousand nine hundred and seven, to the thirtieth day of June, one thousand nine hundred and eight (inclusive of both dates), and for supplementing the grants made by the last Parliament, in its Third Session, in adjustment of the vote "Advance to Treasurer, Consolidated Revenue Fund, 1906–1907," for charges during the period from the first day of July, one thousand nine hundred and six, to the thirtieth day of June, one thousand nine hundred and seven (inclusive of both dates), to be provided for out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund, and on account of Public Works and other Services to be provided for out of the Public Works Fund, and for supplementing the vote "Advance to Treasurer, Public Works Fund, 1906-7," for charges during the period from the first day of July, one thousand nine hundred and six, to the thirtieth day of June, one thousand nine hundred and seven (inclusive of both dates), and for services to be provided for out of the Closer Settlement Fund: And whereas we desire to make good out of the said Funds the several sums granted to Your Majesty as aforesaid: Be it therefore enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of the State of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—
