Act No. 10, 1908.

(SUPERANNUATION).

An Act to provide that certain deductions from superannuation allowances under the Act No. 55 of 1899 shall, under certain circumstances, cease to be made; and for purposes consequent thereon and incidental thereto. [16th November, 1908.]

DE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with B the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

Short title.

- 1. This Act may be cited as the "Public Service (Superannuation) Act, 1908."
 - 2. Where—

(a) any person who has been employed as an officer in the public service is at the commencement of this Act in the receipt of a superannuation allowance under and by virtue of section two of the Act No. 55 of 1899; and

- (b) in pursuance of the said section the superannuation allowance to which he would have been entitled if he had retired from the service under the provisions of section forty-three of the Civil Service Act of 1884 has been diminished by an amount certified by the actuaries appointed under that Act to be equivalent to the annuity terminable on his death into which the amount of any payments, gratuities, and refunds received by him on his retirement from the service is convertible; and
- (c) the sum of the amounts by which such allowance has from time to time been diminished as aforesaid, has at any time before or after the commencement of this Act equalled the amount of the payments, gratuities, and refunds received as

the superannuation allowance payable to the said person shall thereupon be deemed to have ceased to be diminished as aforesaid.
