WHEREAS we Your Majesty's most dutiful and loyal subjects, the members of the Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, have granted to Your Majesty the several sums hereinafter mentioned for the service of the year from the first day of July, one thousand nine hundred and eleven, to the thirtieth day of June, one thousand nine hundred and twelve, (inclusive of both dates), and for supplementing the grants made by the present Parliament, in its First Session, in adjustment of the vote "Advance to Treasurer," 1910-11, Consolidated Revenue Fund, for supplementary charges during the period from the first day of July, one thousand nine hundred and ten, to the thirtieth day of June, one thousand nine hundred and eleven (inclusive of both dates); in adjustment of the Votes "Advance to Treasurer," 1903-4 and previous year, Consolidated Revenue Fund, for supplementary charges during the period from the first day of July, one thousand nine hundred and two, to the thirtieth day of June, one thousand nine hundred and four (inclusive of both dates); to cover payments "Unauthorised in Suspense," for urgent claims on account of services of the year 1910-11 to be provided for out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund; and on account of Public Works and other services to be provided for out of the Public Works Fund; and for services to be provided for out of the Closer Settlement Fund: And whereas we desire to make good out of the said funds the several sums granted to Your Majesty as aforesaid: Be it therefore enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of the State of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

The Colonial Treasurer shall issue and pay the said several Treasurer shall pay sums for the purposes hereinbefore mentioned in such manner and by warrant or order. in such proportions as the Governor by any warrant or order in writing under his hand and directed to the said Treasurer may from time to time order and direct, and the payments so to be made shall be charged upon and payable out of the said funds respectively; but the said Treasurer shall not be held liable for any claims which may arise in connection with any of the State Departments transferred to the Commonwealth on or after the date of such transfer.
- 5. The said Treasurer shall in his Accounts from time to time Treasurer shall be be allowed credit for any sum or sums of money paid by him in allowed credit for moneys paid by him. pursuance of such warrant or order in writing as aforesaid, and the receipts of the respective persons to whom the same are so paid shall be a full and valid discharge to the said Treasurer in passing his said Accounts for any such sums as may be therein mentioned, and he shall receive credit for the same accordingly.
