## AUCTIONEERS' LICENSING (AMENDMENT) ACT.

## Act No. 41, 1915.

George V. An Act to enable auctioneers to sell wool after sunset in the area of the municipality of Albury; to amend the Auctioneers' Licensing Act, 1898, and the Acts relating to early closing. [Assented to, 13th December, 1915.]

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

Short title.

1. This Act may be cited as the "Auctioneers' Licensing (Amendment) Act, 1915."

Permits to sell wool at any time.

2. Section eighteen of the Auctioneers' Licensing Act, 1898, is amended by the addition of the following proviso:—

"Provided that a court of petty sessions may, on application, grant a permit to an auctioneer, who holds an auctioneer's license under this Act, to put up to sale or sell after sunset, in the area of the municipality of Albury, any wool not being on the skin, notwithstanding anything contained in the Acts relating to early closing.

"Such permit may be revoked at any time by the court issuing it, but if not revoked shall be in force during the currency of the auctioneer's license.

"It shall apply only to the auctioneer named therein, and be available only in the said area."
