

PUBLIC INSTRUCTION
(AMENDMENT) ACT.

Act No. 20, 1917.

An Act to amend the law enforcing the attendance at school ; to amend the Public Instruction Act of 1880, and the Public Instruction (Amendment) Act, 1916. [Assented to, 7th November, 1917.] George V,

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows :—

1. This Act may be cited as the “ Public Instruction (Amendment) Act, 1917.” Short title.

(a) Subsection one by adding at the end of the subsection the words “or a school subsidised under the provisions of the Principal Act or the regulations thereunder”.

(b) Subsection two by inserting after the words “certified school” each time they occur the words “or school subsidised as aforesaid”.

Amendment
of s. 8 (3).

3. Section eight of the same Act is amended in subsection three by inserting after the words “certified school” the words “or a school subsidised under the provisions of the Principal Act or the regulations thereunder”.
