ARMIDALE WATER SUPPLY ACT.

Act No. 32, 1922.

George V, An No. 32.

Act to sanction the carrying out of certain works to augment the water supply of the Municipality of Armidale; and for purposes connected therewith. [Assented to, 24th November, 1922.]

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

Short title.

1. This Act may be cited as the "Armidale Water Supply Act, 1922."

Works sanctioned.

2. The carrying out of the works described in the Schedule to this Act is hereby sanctioned, and the Secretary for Public Works is empowered to carry out the said works.

The plan.

3. The plan of the said works is the plan marked "Armidale Water Supply, Dumaresq Creek Scheme," signed by the Secretary for Public Works, and countersigned by the Chief Engineer for Water Supply and Sewerage, and deposited in the public office of the said Secretary.

Cost.

4. The cost of carrying out the said works is estimated at thirty-two thousand pounds (exclusive of land resumptions), and such estimated cost shall not under any circumstances be exceeded by more than ten per centum.

SCHEDULE,

George V, No. 32.

The construction of an earth dam on Dumaresq Creek, 50 feet high, with a concrete core, to impound about 200,000,000 gallons; a pipe line about 1,386 feet long and 10 inches in diameter from the dam to the present gravitation main; and an additional service reservoir with a capacity of about 600,000 gallons, and all works incidental thereto, such works to be completed under the direction of the Secretary for Public Works; the whole to be subject to such modifications as the Constructing Authority may think advisable.
