PRINCE ALFRED HOSPITAL (ISOLATION BLOCK) ACT.

Act No. 42, 1923.

George V, An Act to sanction the construction of an isolation block in connection with the Royal Prince Alfred Hospital for the treatment of venereal diseases; and for purposes connected therewith. [Assented to, 21st December, 1923.]

DE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

Short title.

1. This Act may be cited as the "Prince Alfred Hospital (Isolation Block) Act, 1923."

Work sanctioned.

2. The carrying out of the work described in the Schedule is sanctioned, and the Secretary for Public Works is empowered to carry out the same.

3.

3. The plan of the said work is the plan marked George V, "Royal Prince Alfred Hospital—Proposed Venereal No. 42. Clinic," signed by the Secretary for Public Works The plan, and countersigned by the Government Architect, and deposited in the public office of the said Secretary.

4. The cost of carrying out the said work is estimated Cost at thirty-six thousand five hundred and twenty pounds, and such estimated cost shall not under any circumstances be exceeded by more than ten per centum.

SCHEDULE.

The building will be two storeys high, the walls being constructed of bricks on concrete pier foundations: the roof will be of tiles.

The ground floor is designed mainly for the treatment of out-patients, and the first floor will consist of wards for immates.

The general construction will be fire-proof, the floors being of concrete.

The whole to be subject to such modifications and amendments as the Constructing Authority may think desirable.
