ACT.

Act No. 24, 1932.

An Act to relieve the Electoral Commissioner from the duty of complying with section 120c of the Parliamentary Electorates and Elections Act, 1912-1929, in relation to the general election held on the eleventh day of June, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-two; for that purpose to amend the said Act; and for purposes connected therewith. [Assented to, 10th October, 1932.]

**B**E it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

**1.** (1) This Act may be cited as the "Parliamentary Electorates and Elections (Amendment) Act, 1932," and shall be read and construed with the Parliamentary Electorates and Elections Act, 1912-1929.

Short title.

(2) This Act shall be deemed to have commenced upon the eleventh day of June, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-two.

Commencement.

**2.** It shall not be necessary for the Electoral Commissioner to comply with the requirements of section 120c of the Parliamentary Electorates and Elections Act, 1912-1929, in relation to the general election held on the eleventh day of June, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-two.
