

PUBLIC HEALTH (FURTHER AMENDMENT) ACT.

Act No. 35, 1944.

An Act to amend the Public Health (Amendment) Act, 1921; and for purposes connected therewith. [Assented to, 8th December, 1944.] George VI.

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the "Public Health (Further Amendment) Act, 1944." Short title.

2. The Public Health (Amendment) Act, 1921, is amended— Amendment

(a) by inserting in paragraph (1) of subsection one of section four after the word "bedding" the words and symbols "(whether new or second hand)"; Sec. 4.
(Regulations.)

(b) by inserting next after the same paragraph the following new paragraph:—

(1a) for the regulation of the business of manufacturing or repairing bedding, upholstery, or any similar articles, and without prejudice to the generality of the foregoing provisions, for securing the cleanliness according to the standard prescribed of flock and other filling materials used for or in connection with the conduct of any such business, and for prohibiting any person engaged in any such business from storing or having on premises used

used for or in connection with the conduct of any such business any flock or other filling materials which are not clean according to the standard prescribed.
