

PURE FOOD (AMENDMENT) ACT.

Act No. 9, 1953.

Elizabeth II, No. 9, 1953. An Act to increase the penalties for certain offences under the Pure Food Act, 1908-1944; for this purpose to amend the said Act; and for purposes connected therewith. [Assented to, 25th September, 1953.]

BE it enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. (1) This Act may be cited as the "Pure Food (Amendment) Act, 1953".

(2) The Pure Food Act, 1908, as amended by subsequent Acts and by this Act, may be cited as the Pure Food Act, 1908-1953.

2. The Pure Food Act, 1908-1944, is amended—

- (a) by omitting from subsection one of section thirty-six the words “twenty pounds”, “fifty pounds” and “one hundred pounds” and by inserting in lieu thereof the words “fifty pounds”, “one hundred pounds” and “two hundred and fifty pounds” respectively;
- (b) by omitting from subsection one of section fifty-four the words “prescribing penalties not exceeding twenty pounds or a continuing penalty not exceeding two pounds per diem for a contravention of any regulation; and” and by inserting in lieu thereof the words “prescribing penalties not exceeding fifty pounds for the first offence, not exceeding one hundred pounds for the second offence and not exceeding two hundred and fifty pounds for any subsequent offence, and a continuing penalty not exceeding five pounds per diem, for a contravention of any provision of the regulations.”
