

**PUBLIC SERVICE AND OTHER STATUTORY
BODIES (EXTENDED LEAVE) ACT.**

Act No. 5, 1958.

An Act to amend the provisions relating to long service leave contained in the Public Service (Amendment) Act, 1919, the Irrigation Act, 1912, the Main Roads Act, 1924, the Government Railways Act, 1912, the Transport Act, 1930, and the Police Regulation Act, 1899, and certain other Acts; and for purposes connected therewith. [Assented to, 31st March, 1958.] Elizabeth II,
No. 5, 1958.

BE it enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows :—

1. This Act may be cited as the "Public Service and Other Statutory Bodies (Extended Leave) Act, 1958". Short title.
