

**POLICE REGULATION (AMENDMENT) ACT.**

**Act No. 49, 1963.**

**Elizabeth II, No. 49, 1963** An Act to make further provision with respect to extended leave of members of the Police Force; for this purpose to amend the Police Regulation Act, 1899, as amended by subsequent Acts; and for purposes connected therewith. [Assented to, 13th December, 1963.]

**B**E it enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows :—

**Short title and citation.** 1. (1) This Act may be cited as the "Police Regulation (Amendment) Act, 1963".

(2) The Police Regulation Act, 1899, as amended by subsequent Acts and by this Act, may be cited as the Police Regulation Act, 1899-1963.

**Amendment of Act No. 20, 1899.** 2. The Police Regulation Act, 1899, as amended by subsequent Acts, is amended by inserting next after section 12E the following new section :—

**Restriction on member promoted after 58th birthday taking extended leave.**

12F. Where a member of the police force has, after his fifty-eighth birthday, been appointed to a higher rank or grade in the police force, he shall not, except in a special case approved by the Commissioner, be permitted to take any extended leave during the period of twelve months next following the date of such appointment.
