**Act No. 57, 1972.**

An Act to make further provisions with respect to the licensing of potato growers; to increase the amount payable out of the special account to meet the costs of administration of the Potato Growers Licensing Act, 1940; for these purposes to amend that Act; and for purposes connected therewith. [Assented to, 31st October, 1972.]

**B**E it enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the "Potato Growers Short title. Licensing (Amendment) Act, 1972".

**Amendment of Act No. 13, 1940.**    **3.** The Potato Growers Licensing Act, 1940, is amended—

- (a) (i) by omitting from section 3 the words “one acre” wherever occurring and by inserting instead the words “one-quarter of one acre”;
- (ii) by omitting from section 3 (1) the words “After the expiration of a period of three months from the commencement of this Act no person” and by inserting instead the words “No person”;
- (iii) by omitting from section 3 (4) the words “, after the expiration of the period referred to in subsection one of this section,”;

- (b) by omitting from section 4 (5) the words “ten per centum” and by inserting instead the words “twenty per centum”;

- (c) by omitting section 9 (3) and by inserting instead the following subsection :—

(3) Section 41 of the Interpretation Act, 1897, applies in respect of a regulation as if this Act had been passed after the commencement of the Interpretation (Amendment) Act, 1969.
