Act No. 135, 1978.

An Act to amend section 26 of the Physiotherapists Registration Act, 1945, to exclude from the operation of that Act the practice of a registered chiropractor or osteopath. [Assented to, 21st December, 1978.]

Physiotherapists Registration (Chiropractic) Amendment.

BE it enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows :—

Short title. **1.** This Act may be cited as the "Physiotherapists Registration (Chiropractic) Amendment Act, 1978".

Commence-ment. **2.** (1) This section and section 1 shall commence on the date of assent to this Act.

(2) Except as provided in subsection (1), this Act shall commence on the day appointed and notified under section 2 (2) of the Chiropractic Act, 1978.

Amendment of Act No. 9, 1945. **3.** The Physiotherapists Registration Act, 1945, is amended—

Sec. 26.
(Unregis-tered person not to practise or hold himself out as physio-therapist.)

(a) by omitting section 26 (2) (a) and (b) and by inserting instead the following paragraphs :—

(a) by any person in the ordinary course of his practice as a legally qualified medical practitioner, a dentist registered under the Dentists Act, 1934, a chiropractor or osteopath registered under the Chiropractic Act, 1978, or a chiropodist registered under the Chiropodists Registration Act, 1962;

(b) by a nurse acting under the instructions given to him or her by—

(i) a physiotherapist; or

(ii) a person referred to in paragraph (a);

- (b) by omitting from section 26 (2) (c) the words "as aforesaid" and by inserting instead the words "under the Dentists Act, 1934";
