A BILL

To appropriate out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund an annual amount for the salaries of two additional Ministers of the Crown ; to amend the Constitution Act, 1902, and the Ministers' Salaries Act, 1907 ; and for other purposes.

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows :—

1. This Act may be cited as the " Additional Ministers Short title. of the Crown Act, 1914."

2. Section three of the Ministers' Salaries Act, 1907, is amended—

Amendment of s. 3 of Ministers' Salaries Act, 1907.

(a) by omitting the words "eleven thousand and forty" and inserting in lieu thereof the words "thirteen thousand seven hundred and eighty"; and

(b) by omitting the words and figures—

"Six Ministers of the Crown,
£1,370 each £8,220 0 0"

and inserting in lieu thereof the words and figures—

"Eight Ministers of the Crown,
£1,370 each £10,960 0 0"

3. Section four of the same Act is amended by inserting at the end of the section the words—

Amendment of s. 4.

"Minister for Labour and Industry,
"Minister"

Two additional Ministers.

4. Subsection one of section thirty-one of the Constitution Act, 1902, is repealed, and the following subsections substituted therefor:—

Amendment of s. 31 ss. (1) of the Constitution Act.

(1) The Members of the Legislative Assembly shall, before proceeding to the despatch of any other business, elect a Member to be Speaker.

Election of Speaker.

(2) The said Assembly may by vote remove any Speaker.

(3) As often as the office of Speaker becomes vacant through death, resignation, or by removal as aforesaid, the said Members shall elect a Member to be Speaker.
