A BILL

To amend the Animals Infectious Diseases Act of 1888.

BE it enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows :—

1. Where the Governor by proclamation in the Gazette declares that the provisions of this Act apply in respect of any noxious and infectious microbes described in the proclamation, any person who in respect of any such microbes, or in respect of any animal, or the dead body or any portion of the dead body of any animal inoculated or otherwise infected with any such microbe, does or neglects to do anything by reason whereof he becomes liable to fine or imprisonment under section eleven of the Animals Infectious Diseases Act of 1888 shall, in lieu of such fine or imprisonment, be liable to imprisonment for a term not exceeding years.

Where microbes
proclaimed,
punishment under
s. 11 of Animals
Infectious Diseases
Act shall be
imprisonment.

For the purposes of this section a microbe may be described by its name, or by reference to the disease or pestilence which in the opinion of the Governor it is capable of producing.

2. This Act may be cited as the "Animals Infectious Diseases (Amendment) Act, 1898." Short title.
