A BILL

To amend the Apiaries Act, 1916, as amended by the Apiaries (Amendment) Act, 1917; and for purposes connected therewith.

DE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. (1) This Act may be cited as the "Apiaries Short title. (Amendment) Act, 1927." (2)15993

(2) In this Act the Apiaries Act, 1916, as amended by the Apiaries (Amendment) Act, 1917, is referred to as the Principal Act.

(3) The Principal Act as amended by this Act

may be cited as the Apiaries Act, 1916-1926.

2. The Principal Act is amended— Amendment of Act No. 24, 1916. (a) (i) by omitting from section two the words (Definitions.) "control of" and by inserting in lieu Sec. 2. thereof the words "context or";

(ii) by inserting in the same section at the end of the definition of "beekeeper" the words "and the occupier of any land or premises on which are kept any bees";

(b) by omitting from paragraph (a) of section Sec. 4. four the words "be kept" and by inserting in (Infected lieu thereof the word "remain";

(c) (i) by inserting in section six after the word Sec. 6. "where" the words "he has reason to (Power of

(ii) by inserting in the same section after the word "appliances" the word "honey";

(d) (i) by omitting from subsection one of section Sec. 7. seven the words "make an order directing (Power to the beekeeper in charge to destroy such destroy bees.) bees" and by inserting in lieu thereof the words "order the beekeeper to destroy such bees within a time specified in the order";

(ii) by omitting subsection two of the same

section:

(h) by omitting section twelve and by inserting in New sec. 12. lieu thereof the following new section:

12. (1) Every beekeeper shall register his (Registration apiary in such a manner and at such times as of apiary.) may be prescribed.

Every application for such registration shall

be accompanied by the prescribed fee.

- (2) A beekeeper who removes his apiary shall within fourteen days of such removal give notice thereof in the manner and form prescribed.
- (3) A beekeeper who fails to comply with any of the provisions of this section is liable to a penalty not exceeding twenty pounds.
