A BILL

To amend the Auctioneers' Licensing Act, 1898.

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1. This Act may be cited as the "Auctioneers' Licensing Short title.

(Amendment) Act, 1911.

2. Section eighteen of the Auctioneers' Licensing Act, 1898, Permits to sell wool, skins, hides, and is amended by the addition of the following proviso:tallow at any time.

"Provided that a court of petty sessions may, on application, grant a permit to an auctioneer to put up to sale or sell after sunset any wool, skins, hides, or tallow.

"Such permit may be revoked at any time by the court issuing it, but if not revoked shall be in force until the first of

January next after the date of issue.

"It shall apply only to the auctioneer named therein, and be available only in the police district wherein it was issued."
