A BILL

To authorise the issue of Auctioneers' Licenses for New South Wales to auctioneers resident in other States of the Commonwealth of Australia; to amend the Auctioneers' Licensing Act, 1898, and certain other Acts; and for purposes connected therewith.

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the "Auctioneers' Short title. Licensing (Interstate) Act, 1922," and shall be construed with the Auctioneers' Licensing Act, 1898, and the Acts amending the same.

- 2. This Act shall come into operation on a day to be Commence-fixed by a proclamation of the Governor published in ment of Act. the Gazette.
- 3. In this Act "State" means a State of the Commonwealth of Australia, but does not include New South Wales.

4. (1) When the Governor is satisfied that under Governor's the law for the time being in force in any State—

- (a) any person resident in New South Wales and certain holding a general auctioneer's license under States. the Auctioneers' Licensing Act, 1898, or any Act amending it, may obtain a license to follow the occupation of an auctioneer in all parts of such State; and
- (b) the fee payable by such person for obtaining a license as aforesaid in that State does not exceed the sum stipulated therefor in any agreement entered into between the Governments of New South Wales and of that State—

the Governor may by order published in the Gazette declare that on and after a date to be specified in such order, and while such order remains in force, this Act shall apply to the issuing in New South Wales of general auctioneers' licenses to residents in such State.

(2) The Governor may, if he thinks fit, revoke Power to any such order.

- 6. The Auctioneers' Licensing Act, 1898, and the Application Schedules thereto, with such modifications as may be of Act of necessary to bring the same into conformity with this Act, shall apply in respect of licenses authorised by this Act.
